Currency: Euro (€)

Weather in Lisbon:

- **Fall (October to November):** Pleasant, with temperatures ranging from 15°C to 22°C.
- **Winter (December to February):** Cooler and rainy, with temperatures between 8°C and 15°C.
- **Spring (March to May):** Mild temperatures between 15°C and 22°C, with less rain.

Transportation in Lisbon:

- **Buses and Trams:** The city has an extensive network of buses and trams.
- **Metro:** Connects key tourist spots and areas of interest.
- **Taxis and Ride Apps:** Available throughout the city.
- **Trains:** Connect Lisbon to nearby towns and tourist destinations.

Airport Transportation to Lisbon City Center



Humberto Delgado Airport (LIS):

2. **Aerobus:** The Aerobus service provides direct transportation from the airport to various parts of the city, including the city center and the Praça

do Comércio area. Frequent departures. Travel time varies based on traffic.

3. **Taxis:** Taxis are available outside the arrivals terminal for direct transport to your desired destination in Lisbon's city center.
