Important Information

Entrance to St. Peter's Basilica is free . However, there are some areas and activities within the Basilica that may require an additional fee  : (Click the Links) 

- **Basilica Dome:** There is a fee to climb the dome . You can choose to go up on foot  or use the elevator to a certain point and then continue on foot . The view from the top is

spectacular and offers a panoramic view of Rome and the Vatican 🏰.

- **Vatican Necropolis:** Also known as Scavi, this is the underground area where St. Peter's tomb is located 🏰. To visit, you need to book in advance 📅^{July}₁₇ and there is an entrance fee.

It is always recommended to arrive early 🕒, as the line to enter the Basilica can be long, especially during peak tourist season ☀️. Additionally, remember that there is a strict dress code 👗 👖: visitors must cover their shoulders and knees to enter.

Fontana di Trevi
